## **Purpose**

To prescribe the responsibilities of *Signallers* in the *Australian Rail Track Corporation (ARTC) NSW Network.* 

## Responsibilities

The primary responsibility of Signallers is to set *routes* for the safe and efficient *transit* of *trains* in the area under their control.

## Signallers must.

- make sure that signalling equipment is operated safely
- respond to signalling equipment failures and warning alarms
- in accordance with ARTC Network Rules and Network Procedures, authorise and issue Proceed Authorities and work on track authorities
- get authority from the *Train Controller* for unscheduled *rail traffic* to depart their area of control
- tell affected Train Controllers and Signallers about train movements that become delayed or out-of-course
- as required, report rail traffic details to affected Train Controllers and Signallers
- promptly report breaches of ARTC Network Rules and Network Procedures to the controlling officer and the Train Controller.

Signallers may divert rail traffic to avoid unnecessary delays.

Signallers must compile and maintain, in *permanent form*, relevant records and reports about:

- authorities issued by them
- conditions and movements in sections and locations under their authority
