

### A visit from our future farmers

When we heard about the students of Hermidale Primary School in central NSW growing and selling their own wheat crop, we wanted to show them how their grain travelled to the Port of Newcastle for export.

We invited the school's 15 students and three teachers to visit our Network Control Centre in Newcastle for a rare glimpse into how the rail network is managed and to follow the journey their wheat took from Hermidale to the world.

The students watched our Network Controllers managing train movements across the Hunter Valley and Central North West, and plotted the route their grain took from Narromine to the port. We also talked about why we need to always 'stop, look and listen' at level crossings. Remember, it can take a train up to two kilometres to stop – which is the length of the Hermidale Public School cross country course!
