

The information you've provided so far indicates that this event has resulted in a spill or release of a pollutant to the environment and notification to external authorities may be required. Follow these steps to confirm that notification is required and notify the event:

1. Contact an [ARTC Environmental Representative](#) for advice (if not already done). If an Environmental Representative cannot be contacted, the following table can be used to help determine whether an event requires external notification.

<b>DOES THE EVENT REQUIRE EXTERNAL NOTIFICATION?</b>	<b>POTENTIAL HARM IS LOW</b> e.g. controllable leak/spill of diesel, chemicals, dangerous goods Controllable dust, smoke, muddy water Material is inert (e.g. coal, blue metal)	<b>POTENTIAL HARM IS HIGH</b> e.g. uncontrolled or large volume of diesel, chemicals, dangerous goods Uncontrolled dust, smoke, muddy water
<b>SENSITIVE LOCATION</b> e.g. impact to a National Park, private property, waterway, drain, other sensitive site	<b>NOTIFIABLE</b> e.g. small leak/spill within a National Park, adjacent to a waterway or moves off-site.	<b>NOTIFIABLE</b> e.g. large, concentrated spill within a National Park, adjacent to a waterway or moves off-site.
<b>DISTURBED LOCATION</b> Completely within rail corridor disturbance footprint or bunded area	<b>NOT NOTIFIABLE</b> e.g. small leak /spill within the rail corridor which is contained. Coal/grain spill.	<b>NOTIFIABLE</b> e.g. large, uncontrolled spill of a fuel/chemical over a large section of track or rail corridor.
